Mary Magdalene: A Model for Women's Ministry

Luke 7: 37-38

Now there was a sinful woman in the city who learned that he (Jesus) was at table in the house of a Pharisee. Bringing an alabaster flask of ointment, she stood behind him as his feet weeping and began to bathe his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them, and anointed them with the ointment.

Mark 16:1 -8

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary, the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go and anoint him. Very early when the sun had risen, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb. They were saying to one another, "Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?"
